Interview with Joanna Pudney as part of Prison Residencies:

- 1. Please tell us about your arts practice?
- JP-My practice is a combination of 2 and 3D work. It is also a combination of Fine Art and Illustration.

My main themes are the Uncanny, Symbolism and Rituals. I'm also inspired by Folk tales, Surrealism and DaDa.

- 2. How did you develop your ideas for the prison residencies project?
- JP-My ideas were quite difficult to pin down as the Prison was so inspirational. I initially researched Oakham Picking thinking of creating an instillation. But further research drew me towards the punishment methods of Separation and Silence, particularly the masks women had to wear. I was also interested in the unravelling of women prisoners identities.
- 3. As you spilt your time working in person and working remotely how did you find your experience?
- JP-The experience ran smoothly between the locations which was a necessity for me at this time. Although, I gained more from working alongside other artists at the Prison.
- 4. Were you able to collaborate with any other arts while on the residency?
- JP-I didn't produce anything in collaboration but greatly benefitted from working within the group and creative conversation.
- 5. Will you continue to work on this subject matter? Future plans?
- JP-Yes, I will continue and hopefully work towards some of the other ideas too.
